- Always stay in control. You must be able to stop or avoid other people or objects.
- 6 Always use proper devices to prevent runaway equipment.
- People ahead of you have the rightof-way. It is your respon- sibility to avoid them.
- **7** Observe and obey all posted signs and warnings.
- 3 Do not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above.
- 8 Keep off closed trails and closed areas.
- 4 Before starting downhill or merging onto a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
- You must not use lifts or terrain if your ability is impaired through use of alcohol or drugs.
- f you are involved in or witness a collision or accident, you must remain at the scene and identify yourself to the Ski Patrol.
- 10 You must have sufficient physical dexterity, ability and knowledge to safely load, ride and unload lifts. If in doubt, ask the lift attendant.
